## Background

MamboSteunPunt is a non-profit foundation which is concerned with the development of the Area around Mambo, a small village at the edge of the Usambara mountains in the Lushoto district in Tanzania. It is closely connected to the eco lodge MamboViewPoint which is owned by social entrepreneurs Marion Neidt and Herman Erdtseick from the Netherlands. They are working closely together with the local inhabitants in an attempt to increase the quality of life.



The basic idea is to have a permanent socio-economic stable base in a poor area and to bring development from there.

MamboViewPoint is providing this stable base, and the foundation MamboSteunPunt is responsible for the development work. In this way all the needed infrastructure for the foundation is provided by the lodge and near to 100% of the donated money can be spent on the projects. Moreover it provides a clear borderline between the commercial activities from the lodge and the projects.

In the MamboSteunPunt vision development is not based on unconditional aid but should be achieved by empowering people, building capacities, giving them ideas and information, knowledge, expertise and support them in obtaining tools.

After a fact-finding mission early 2008, in 2009 MamboViewPoint eco lodge was established in the Usambara Mountains in Tanzania. It is situated on a beautiful spot near Mambo/Mtae, which is an area with many opportunities but the population has an average income below the poverty line.

In addition, in 2015 the local NGO JamiSawaa is established which is meant to run the projects in the field. With this the role of MamboSteunPunt is reduced to fund raising and acquisition, selecting of volunteers and empowerment of the JamiiSawa members.

The lodge is focusing on the mid-range level in the market segment for eco tourism / sustainable tourism. The last is very important since, in our vision, it is the best way for the local people and Tanzania to get the most out of it without spoiling the own identity and nature.



After the elections end 2015 president Magufuli came in charge. Soon we started to notice this as a game changer for the development of Tanzania. He actively started to fight corruption and turned to a remarkable way to prosperity for Tanzania. Now, halfway 2018 we can say that his politics continued and a lot changed already for the better. MamboSteunPunt is excited to be part of this change in Tanzania. It increased the possibilities for sustainable development like MamboSteunPunt is aiming for. In 2016 and 2017 we noticed already a lot of changes in Mambo and around. All of the sudden the governmental money is used where it is meant for and village leaders are getting nervous and are encouraged to do something for the community.

This, together with the growing possibilities and achievements lead MamboSteunPunt to a next phase in the project which was reached in 2016 and was rolled out further in 2017.

### **Business achievements** <responsibility MamboViewPoint ltd>

From July 2011 the lodge reached a breakeven point. Unfortunately, the economic recession and later the Ebola disease restrained the number of visitors from a further rise. Although in whole Tanzania the number of tourists descended in 2014 MamboViewPoint succeeded to keep the number only a bit less compared to 2013. This was special thanks of the fact that about 50% of the guests are expats who are less affected by trendy things like being afraid of Ebola.

The expectations for 2018 and beyond are good. In 2016 and 2017 an increasing number of tour operators were interested to bring guests and developed itineraries which included MamboViewPoint. Also the own packages including transport from Arusha and drop off in Pangani as well as the more day hikes are increasing attracting interest.

Unfortunately, business wise there are still threats like an decreasing business climate, an increasing amount of all kind of levies, juridical complications and a constant stream of people and authorities pushed to reach the targets to collect tax money.

After reducing corruption also more laws and levies are stricter enrolled and there is too much focus to increase tax income. Also visa for staff and volunteers, staying longer than 3 months, are terrible difficult or not to get. This is putting even more pressure on the source of income to survive, also for the lodge. We are also eager waiting on measurements to increase the business climate. If this does not happen it can be disastrous as well for the lodge as well for the local entrepreneurs and the local economic growth which we try to encourage.

### **Development achievements** <responsibility MamboSteunPunt>

On the project side the number and dimensions of the projects are growing to a new level. Highlights in 2017 were the health projects, the renewal of the football pitch and the Push&Pull organic grow of maize. ### **Legal structure / JamiiSawa**

Initial the idea was to establish a counterpart NGO (Non-Governmental Organisation) or CBO (Community Based Organisation) in Tanzania. An investigation showed however that a local organisation with funding from abroad would have a high risk on disappearing money and obstructing activities due to endless meetings and “greedy people”. This made us decide to work with MamboSteunPunt as foundation based in the Netherlands and commercial structures like MamboViewPoint, small local enterprises in Tanzania and from there cooperate with the local CBO’s, women groups and the local councils. For the time being this still seems to be an efficient and good manageable solution which secures a minimum loss of donated money.

Although at the end of 2013 we reached the stage already where the right local people are found who could be able to manage the development projects. This made us to establish a new local NGO, called JamiiSawa, which can manage the community projects and has to reduce the role of MamboSteunPunt to one of mainly funding the projects. Also the local villagers will have a bigger say in JamiiSawa and finally be able to manage the projects themselves with a little support only.

The seeds are laid in 2014 and the official registration and got its take off in 2015.

The idea is that JamiiSawa will be responsible for the projects around Mambo and that the role of MamboSteunPunt is reduced to funding, recruiting volunteers and gaining knowledge.

The continuing experiences however show that there is still a long way to go to reach the required skills and accountability within JamiiSawa. Luckily this time is available and we can work on it. In 2017 JamiiSawa was grilled by the government and survived the closure of another 600 NGO’s who could not prove to do something good for the community.

### **Boardmembers MamboSteunPunt**

At the end of 2017, a number of boardmembers of MamboSteunPunt are thinking to drop down their function as a boardmember of MamboSteunPunt: Marion Neidt, Maud Verheij, Kim Nieuwland and Gijs de Wit. The idea is to find new members in the beginning of 2018.

### **MamboSteunPunt in the Netherlands**

MamboSteunPunt in the Netherlands has activities like fundraising, selecting volunteers and bookkeeping. A steady number of people supported the activities in Mambo in 2017 in a fabulous way. With this we have to thank them so much. Sixteen volunteers participated in various projects, like education, food, art classes, office management, circus, sports and health care. Volunteers stayed between 14 days and over a year. Others returned even more times Since the contribution of some volunteers is overwhelming, we still are looking for a new word for this kind of volunteers which is expressing their position better.



## **Projects**

The main goal from the projects is to bring development and to improve economics. Once people have more income, they also can pay for schools, health care and other and will have possibilities to reach a better quality of live.

Once doing this we noticed that everything is related; if you are sick you can't work, if you have no clean drinking water you get sick, if you are well educated but there are no jobs you will stay poor etc etc. This is why we have that many projects which effect in many different fields.

For the projects we structured it in four main fields:

- Education
- Health care
- Infrastructure
- Entrepreneurship

In the annex 4 you will find a list of projects which are structured according this four subjects.

## **Future plans**

### *Lodge*

The Lodge is still getting improvements to make it more attractive and to improve services. For the further future the idea is to transfer the ownership of the lodge to MamboSteunPunt as well as to establish the management of the lodge by MamboSteunPunt. The major reason of this is to guarantee the existence and well-functioning of the project even after the current owners of MamboViewPoint will retire. For the time being the goal is to establish this around 2020 and to start additional management in 2017.

In 2017 we were happy to have several management couples who assisted by managing the lodge for 3 month each. This appeared to be a good way to strengthen the management. Also we were happy to receive Hans Valkenburgh who made a new business plan for the lodge. The outcome is helping to find a way to secure the future of the lodge and the projects.

### *Activities*

Since the increasing number of activities, the need to purchase more land is growing. Luckily there is an opportunity for a piece of land next to the lodge. Since the new government also PPP (Public-Private-Partnership) projects can be considered again. One of this is to cooperate with the schools in tablet classes, sports and art classes.



## Accountings

During 2017 we were very happy to receive an stable number of gifts from many guests, NGO's and companies which were owned by guest or where guests were working.

### Local salaries

An increasing part of the spending is going to local salaries. Since people are poor voluntary work for locals is difficult and as long as they deliver good performances it is defendable to pay local salaries. Also we are using an increasing number of skilled workers like teachers who assist in their free time. There is set up a structure for management, teaching and other skilled work and unskilled work. In this way the sustainability of the projects is also better secured. The funding's for the different projects allow to work with paid local participants.

### Village fund in 2017:

The village fund is fed from a contribution of MamboViewPoint and a tip box which is situated with the reception. We were happy to see that the village spent the money on several projects like building new school toilets and extension of the local medical post (dispensary). Apart from the gifts as mentioned above, in 2017 approximately 1.380 euro is collected for the village development fund.

# Welcome to JamiiSawa

Sunga/Mamboleo area has eight villages and about 20,000 inhabitants. Anno 2016 development is still essential at all levels and in almost every aspect. The vast majority of people is living of subsistence agriculture. There is insufficient clean drinking water, poor education, poor health care and infrastructure, shortage of firewood and so on. Shirika La Jamii Na Maendeleo Sawa Usambara (in short JamiiSawa) contributes to the development in the area.

Within JamiiSawa people with different individual backgrounds who live in Sunga area have come together to search for ways to overcome challenges for sustainable community development and to find solutions to improve the quality of life for all people. We want to offer a new approach and additional services to what is already there and enhance potentials and capacities.

## Vision

Our vision is that all people of Sunga/Mamboleo area have a variety of capacities and should have equal chances to consciously contribute to the development process in their community.

## Mission

Our mission is to promote sustainable local development and to strengthen the community in order to improve the living conditions and quality of life for all people living in Sunga/Mamboleo area.

## Objective

The general objective of JamiiSawa is to serve as a platform that assists local people in their process of developing their communities and strengthen them to take up their responsibilities and work together in order to outgrow poverty.

The aim is to define needs and problems within the community and recognize all capacities and opportunities. Ownership and participation of local people are key factors for success to promote community development. Moreover, development implies change and change can give stress which is difficult to deal with, especially in a poor area like Sunga. Therefore, JamiiSawa recognizes the need to build good communication structures between all levels within society and our organization. We strive to live up to a high standard of transparency and accountability of our work and services. JamiiSawa should serve as a platform for communication and networking and provide the infrastructure to channel capacities and efforts for positive change. Doing so together with the people themselves gives a chance to overcome difficulties while using all potentials as a bridge to success.

# Structure

**JamiiSawa** is an umbrella organization of Sungu area where local people and donor organizations come together to discuss together about how development should take place, which projects should be done, the feasibility of the projects. JamiiSawa takes care of the implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the various projects.

**MamboSteunPunt** is initiator from JamiiSawa and currently the main donor for JamiiSawa.

**MamboViewPoint** is the eco Lodge run by social entrepreneurs. Moreover, it is the base of MamboSteunPunt and JamiiSawa in Tanzania. De lodge takes care for a stable base and possible profits are spent on projects in consultation with JamiiSawa. Moreover, the presence of the lodge is an economic stimulus and teaching ground already.

## Our main target issues

We recognize that development has to be dealt with within a broad context. Development is not a one item issue because all problems are interlinked with each other. We as JamiiSawa have categorized our activities in four main issues, education, healthcare, infrastructure and entrepreneurship. JamiiSawa approaches all of these subjects from a broad perspective. Moreover, JamiiSawa strives to have each issue of intervention be supported, in cooperation with the teachers in the lesson subjects at school.

### Education

No need to stress the importance to improve the general knowledge and quality of the education. Without good education no development.

Projects in this field can be:

- Improvement of accessibility to education for all
- Improve school facilities
- Improve teaching aids
- After school activities like child circus, sports, music, theatre, tablet and computer classes

### Health care

Projects in this field can be:

- Reduce risk of diseases (clean drinking water, sanitation, no smoky stoves etc.)
- Improve quality of health care.
- Improve basic knowledge about health and reproductive health.
- Help to improve health care infrastructure

## **Infrastructure**

Infrastructure concerns a wide diversity of fields like:

### **Water**

Projects in this can be field:

- Improve accessibility of water
- Find ways to keep water in the area for longer time, f.e. rainwater catchments and dams
- Planting trees to attract more rain and restore groundwater-levels
- Reducing (water)pollution from agricultural chemicals.

### **Road and waterworks**

Projects in this field can be:

- Improving existing roads
- Making new ones
- Bridges
- Flood prevention
- Improve public facilities like marketplace

### **Forest and environment**

Projects in this field can be:

- Awareness for environment.
- Tree planting.
- Alternatives for logging, charcoal and firewood.
- Alternative income generation activities that are protective for the forest like bee keeping, mushroom growing or guiding so the forest will be assigned a different value

## **Entrepreneurship**

Entrepreneurship is also related to a wide variety of fields but the main focus will be searching for added value for the capacities and available recourses that are already there.

### **Entrepreneurship based on added value**

Projects in this field can be:

- Making cheese and yoghurt.
- Producing jam, soap, honey, mushrooms
- Art, craftworks, pottery
- Improve crops and diversify crop-production
- Linking producers to existing markets

## **New income generating activities**

### **Tourism**

Small scale tourism is one of the possibilities for more income in the Sunga area in the Usambara Mountains.

Projects in this field can be:

- Homestays
- Tour companies
- Improve and specialise guiding
- Improve tourism related activities like sales of art and local products.
- Performances of local music, drama, storytelling etc.

### **New small scale industries**

Building on local products and capacities may result in a small scale industry

Projects in this field can be:

- Carpentry
- Food processing

## **Period 2009 – 2018**

In January 2009 MamboViewPoint EcoLodge was established by social entrepreneurs. The idea was to create a stable base and do all kind of projects from there, not by “giving” aid but by business, trade and empowerment. This new idea for sustainable development in 2013 was supported by Obama who visited Tanzania at that time and later adopted by other development organizations.

Apart from the projects, MamboViewPoint itself already creates a lot of employment, not only by employing workers but also by using local products as much as possible. In 9 years’ time the local economics boosted and many foreigners enjoyed the beauty of the environment, leaving a fair amount of money in the local economics resulting in a few hundred people having an income.

Originally the projects were initiated and managed by the NGO MamboSteunPunt and a number of volunteers from abroad who brought the knowledge and means. The idea however is to make it a project which is mainly managed by the local people from the area.

This is why in 2015 JamiiSawa was founded and takes over all the activities in Sunga area from MamboSteunPunt. JamiiSawa is founded by the very same people who were already actively involved.

## Education

In this section an overview is given from the projects for Education which are done by MamboSteunPunt / JamiiSawa.

After the establishment of the new government end 2015 and its direction to improve PPP (Private Public Partnership) programs, we think JamiiSawa can play a key role in the Sunga area and a new, better synergy between the community projects and government tasks can be established.

JamiiSawa highly values good education since this is one of the main foundations for all development. This is why a lot of projects are targeting better education on primary and secondary level as well for drop outs.

### Refurbishing of classrooms

Since we think it is the task of the government to build schools we don't do this. But unfortunately many classrooms are half build or very dark. A local artist together with schoolchildren and sometimes a volunteer are painting classrooms and make them more attractive with educational paintings on the wall.



### Pens footballs and other materials

Guests of the lodge are bringing materials for the schools. Those are collected and once enough handed to schools in the neighborhood.



### School toilets

In 2009 new school toilets are built at Mambo primary schools: one for girls and one for boys. This to solve the hygienic problems from the school. The liquids and solids are separated to enable composting.



### Finishing schools

In exceptional cases, once there is a demand and work by the community itself, we assist by purchasing building materials for schools



### Games

In 2009 animators and teachers are educated to do games with the children of Mambo. The aim was to develop the intellectual and creative capacities of the children.



### English classes

We organized after-school classes English for students with and without scholarships.



### Extra teachers

Extra teachers were supported for the Mambo primary schools to improve English and math skills of the kids.



### Child circus

We established a child circus where kids can develop their creativity.



### School art

A local artist painted schools on the outside to make them more attractive



### Schoolbooks

We provided the first several hundreds of books for the primary school in Mambo. After a new book series is introduced and free provided by the government this project is stopped.



### Smartboards

The MamboSmart project educational boards are to be produced and distributed to the schools. An artist has an income from this and the schools have more educational material.



### Scholarships

From 2009 in total 13 scholarships for the secondary school are granted. Even for bright children it is often impossible to go to secondary school because their parents cannot afford the school fees. Donating the cost of school fees can make a tremendous difference. Selection of the bright kids who can't afford to study is done in cooperation with representatives from the villages.



### Repair of desks and new desks

On various primary and secondary schools, desks were repaired and new desks were made.



### Television for Sunga secondary school

Once electricity was available MamboViewPoint provided a TV for the Secondary school with documentaries and other educational materials.



### Computer classes

In 2009 we started computer courses for teachers of nearby schools. Later this is extended to programs introducing computer use, Word, Excel, PowerPoint and internet browsing for secondary school students. Currently weekly new students get certificates.



### Awareness for clean water and environment

We placed a clean drinking water tap at the Mambo school and organized awareness lectures on the schools. Moreover, a water-pump is placed at Masanga school where the students granted scholarships study.



### New Football Field

In 2017 the new football field was inaugurated. The Mambo football team reached the second place in the Lushoto football league



### Playing for kids

Games for small kids were introduced in the villages



### Exchange programs

We organized exchange programs with the international school in Dar es Salaam for kids from the secondary school



### Laboratory

MamboViewPoint contributed to the building of the laboratory from the secondary school by providing wood for the roofs



### Child Circus

A new circus theater was established @ MamboViewPoint



### Mountain biking


In 2017 Mountain biking for children is introduced



### Adult education

#### Veterinarian auxillary officers

In 2015 three axillary officers are trained to assist local farmers with basic health of cattle.



#### Push&Pull

In 2015 a project started for organic corn growing which produces more crops.



**Farmers training**

In the period 2009-2015 several farmers are organized and trained for better cow treatment and use of seeds and pesticides



**Traditional birth attendants**

In 2015 a project started in cooperation with the district midwife to educate local birth attendants.



**More farmer training**

Instructions how to make a Cow pan



**Classes for VET auxiliary officers**

3 auxiliary officers were educated for better animal treatment



**Health care**

In this section an overview is given from the projects for health which are done by MamboSteunPunt / JamiiSawa

Good health is a basic need. Without a good functioning basic healthcare, development is an illusion. Therefore a lot of projects JamiiSawa also targets the improvement of health and healthcare.

**Repair of water tank dispensary**

In 2010 the tank from Mambo dispensary was repaired.



**Water taps in Mambo dispensary**

In 2011 water taps, basins and sewage were established in Mambo dispensary.



**New toilets**

In 2009 new toilets were built at Mambo primary school to solve their hygienic problems.



**Nutritious food**

A program for nutritious food is developed to support the schools with better lunches.



**New microscope**

In 2012 a microscope was donated to Mambo dispensary for diagnostics.



**Equipment for Mambo dispensary**

In 2011 new equipment was organized for Mambo dispensary like a blood pressure meter, stethoscope and temperature meter.




**Clean drinking water**

In the period 2009-2015 10 new pumps are placed to provide clean drinking water.



**Water by pipeline**

In 2009 a water pipeline is established from the rainforest which provides around 5000 people from clean drinking water



### Finishing dispensary Tema

In 2014 JamiiSawa assisted the women from Tema to finish the dispensary.



### Vaccination of dogs

In 2013 and 2014 JamiiSawa organized to vaccinate all dogs in the area to prevent Rabies.



### Efficient stoves

In July 2015 a project for improved and efficient stoves in launched. Except that it saves wood (good for income and the forest) it is good for health since there is no smoke.



### Traditional birth attendants

In 2015 a project started to educate local birth attendants to encourage women to give birth in dispensaries



### Village Health Workers

8 new Village Health workers were educated and established to increase the health conditions



## Infrastructure and entrepreneurship

A good functioning infrastructure is essential for a flourishing and productive community. This includes issues like education, healthcare, water-supply. But also the physical infrastructure of roads, bridges, sufficient transport because access to local markets is essential for people to be able to sell their produce. But also good communication and information-structures are basic needs to enable people to make well informed decisions for sustainable solutions.

### JamiiSawa foundation

JamiiSawa will be a platform for discussion, design, initiate and monitor development projects by and for the community.



### Tree nurseries

Establishment of tree nurseries to get more and better adapted trees in the area.



### New bridges

Four new bridges were established resulting in less isolated areas. Busses and trucks can pass again and people are able to construct similar bridges



### Roadworks

On regular base road work is done to keep the area accessible.



### Repair of Mtae-Mnazi road

The road down to Mtae was maintained to keep access to the Usambaras from the direction Arusha and Mnazi.



### Restoring illegal mining activities

Illegal mining activities are restored to protect the forest and the clean water supply.



## Entrepreneurship

### Tourism

By establishing MamboViewPoint eco lodge and MamboCliffInn backpackers lodge more employment came in the area.



### Improved economics

Economics in the area looks booming; many motorbikes, new houses, new clothes, smart phones, pool table café and new other business



### Entrepreneur classes

49 local entrepreneurs finished entrepreneur classes



### Trees

New trees were planted



### Improving livestock

The trained auxiliary officers discuss with local farmers on how they can improve the health of cows and thus their income



### Push&Pull

In 2015 a project is started for organic corn growing which produces more crops without use of chemicals. Moreover, it serves as a way to avoid erosion



### Farmers training

In the period 2009-2015 several farmers are organized and trained for better cattle keeping and use of seeds and pesticides



### Art shop

Local artists are supported to sell their arts to tourists.



### Woodcarving

Local women acquired new skills like woodcarving and painting



### Music groups

Music groups are stimulated to improve their performances so they can perform for more public.



### **Organic farming**

Organic farming is supported for better crops and more income



### **Swahili teaching**

Local teachers are taught how to teach Swahili for foreigners



### **Diary**

Some women groups are established and learned to make yoghurt and cheese.



### **Roofing**

Several people learned how to make makuti roofs and can use their new learned skills elsewhere
