

Developments in 2021 and future plans

Projects

The main goal from the projects is to bring development and improve economics. Once people have more income, they also can pay for education, healthcare and other important aspects which increases the possibility to reach a better quality of life.

Activities are taking place in four different areas of interest: Education, Entrepreneurship, Healthcare and Infrastructure.

The main activities in 2021:

Education

- Scholarships: One student that was granted a scholarship continued her education in the Masange secondary school, and passed her exam for form IV. A new student is granted for the school fees of the secondary school in Lushoto, 2 former secondary school students who were getting scholarships from MsP will also be supported during their higher education for the business school and the school for social development in Dar es Salaam.
- Computer and tablet classes: In 2021 a cooperation with Upendo school started. This appeared to be very successful and students from five secondary schools in the area are attending. Even drop-outs and adults are participating. In 2021 a total of 288 students joined the computer classes, on average for 30 hours. 103 of them managed to get their certificate for basic computer skills. Others were practising other activities like on-line learning. This is considered to be a very successful development, comparing to 2020 when only ... students participated.
- In 2021 support was given to the Tumaini Social Group Mkuzi. This is a carpentry education program for drop-outs. Since their supporting organization from Germany was facing legal problems MsP assisted and managed to get the project in a better state and to solve the legal problems by resolving the old structure and creating a new CBO.

Entrepreneurship

- HappyCowsHappyFarmers: A new project plan was made with 4 key fields:
 - Vaccination of dogs for Rabies; over 200 dogs were vaccinated.
 - Assistance with the making of better cow-pens;
 - Good practises with keeping cattle;
 - several trainings in good practises were organized.
 - Integration and cooperation with the Push&Pull project is prepared.
 - Push&Pull: in 2021 Oliver from Tanzania took off with her new company "Organic hills". The aim is to improve the income of the farmers by storage, organic farming and joined selling of the crops. In 2021 the infrastructure is set up and the training of farmers started. 60+ farmers are joining the project. MsP is supporting the administrative needs and is monitoring the project.

Healthcare

- Health: MsP supported a local women group to establish a workshop for washable sanitation pads which can give better opportunities for girls to attend school and at the same time provides a source of income for the women producing the pads. In 2021 the production took off and thanks to donations 349 girls on 3 different secondary schools received each a package of 5 pads with soap, underwear and a training. Thanks to this more girls can attend the school
- LifeWrap Non-Pneumatic Anti-Shock Garment (NASG) has been successfully deployed to treat postpartum hemorrhage (PPH), leading to reductions in maternal mortality. LifeWraps have proven effective in stabilizing patients so safe transfer can be done. The preparation of supplying LifeWraps to various dispensaries in the Usambara's started in 2021/2020 but the project met an unsuspected hiccup after it appeared that the lifewraps are not ingrained yet in the Tanzanian health system. Although Lushoto is not the first place to use these lifewraps, the other projects were try-outs which were not recognized as best practices by the stakeholders. Attempts to get the necessary permissions did not result in a go-ahead so far.
- The existing doula groups continued their work. The new Doula (tba: traditional birth assistants) trainings were put on hold waiting the take off of the life-wrap project.

Infrastructure

- For the water project 12 pumps which were placed in 2015 with support from MsP were renovated. We noticed a lack of responsibility of users to maintain the pumps. Therefore, the management of the pumps is now outsourced to local entrepreneurs. We hope this will increase the sustainability. With sadness it also appeared that the founder of our partner for the pumps, Paul van Beers from Fairwater in the Netherlands, passed away. We hope the collaboration will continue with his successors.
- Reforestation: In 2021 new seedlings were harvested from the rainforest in cooperation with the forestry. They were put on pots and will be planted in the new rain season, expected to start in April 2022. Law will be enforced to forbid any human activity in the planting area, to increase the success rate. Official signboards are placed already and the Pangani Basin Waterboard will place beacons around the area, since it is also a water collecting area.

Communication

In 2021 various meetings were held. In between there was frequent communication via WhatsApp, Zoom and mail between the Dutch board members and the people in the field. Updates about the activities are communicated via WhatsApp messages and pictures. MSP made 2 newsletters for donors and friends.

Future plans

For 2022 the following activities are foreseen:

Education

Strengthening and extension of the computer classes with on line learning and short courses for practical skills for form IV leavers.

Entrepreneurship

Strengthening and extension of the HappyCowsHappyFarmers program related to improvement of skills, good practices, animal health, vaccination against Rabies and income development. Also MsP will continue to support for the Organic hill / Push&Pull project and the carpentry training in Mkuzi

Healthcare

Implementation of the Lifewrap project, supporting end new training for Doulas and continuous support for the Sanitation Pad program

Infrastructure

Reforestation and strengthening organizations and supplies for water supply.

Local Partners

MamboViewPoint

After a fact-finding mission early 2008, MamboViewPoint eco lodge was established in 2009 in the Usambara Mountains in Tanzania. It is situated on a beautiful spot near Mambo/Mtae, which is an area with many opportunities, but the population has an average income below the poverty line. The lodge is focusing on the mid-range level in the market segment for eco-tourism / sustainable tourism.

From January 2020, a duo by the company name of AD Views is managing the lodge.

We are happy that also AD Views is involved in the development of the area. Their main project is the sisterhood project for after school activities for girls which appears to be very successful.

CBO's

In 2021 a wide range of local CBO's (Community Based Organizations), institutions, companies and private people are supported to establish the various projects. In this approach MamboSteunPunt is not executing the projects, but we assist in development of projects and also to monitor the progress. It appeared that this approach is more sustainable compared to doing projects in a centralized way. This is why this approach is foreseen for 2022 and beyond.

Acquisition

To promote the various projects a YouTube channel, along a Facebook page and Instagram account is started.

Highlights are the Kiwajate movie concerning Sanitation pads and the movie about the restauration of the pumps.

Accountings

During 2021 we were very happy to receive a number of gifts from many supporters and supporting organizations.

In annex 2 you find a more detailed overview of the donations and spendings in 2021. Remaining general costs consist of costs associated with banking, acquisition, and legal requirements. The banking costs are this year very low, caused by course differences. This time in our favor.

Overall, the balance increased with € 1.500. Some donations are linked to specific projects . Examples are projects like Push&Pull, HappyCowsHappyFarmers and Chula. For Healthcare (like traditional birth assistants) there is more money available than costs were made since activities for the lifewraps had to be postponed to 2022. Education: the spending's were higher than the income, since one donor did not fulfil his promises.
